

16 x BURNSIDE RECOVERY CENTER

Central City Concern (CCC) has seen a growing need to fill a gap for increased residential treatment capacity in the community to support people exiting Hooper Detox Stabilization Center (Hooper), people who need an extended period of residential treatment before they can be successful in recovery-supportive housing and substance use disorder (SUD) intensive outpatient placement.

In December 2023, CCC, purchased a building which will serve as a residential treatment center, located at the corner of SE 16th and Burnside in Portland. CCC has developed a culturally responsive and trauma-informed care model that addresses this key care gap.

Program Overview

- Anticipated opening spring 2025.
- 74 bed residential care treatment center providing step-down care, while also helping clients build a strong recovery support system within the community.
- Once ready, clients will receive community re-integration services (e.g. housing and employment) to ensure ongoing post-treatment support.
- Referrals will come from Hooper, the Multnomah County withdrawal management continuum, as well as culturally specific programs.
- Gender and culturally inclusive model for adults living with substance use disorders and mental health conditions.
- Average length of stay: 3-4 months.
- Drug and alcohol-free facility.



Operational Details

- Federally Qualified Health Center.
- Clients voluntarily consent to treatment, program rules/expectations, and restricted visitation hours.
- 68 full time employees supporting the program; 24-hour site presence with active client engagement.
- Staff or approved recovery support members will accompany clients when leaving the facility.
- Clients needing or maintaining methadone supported recovery will be escorted to the CODA clinic or another provider.
- Limited entry and access points.
- Annex lot across the street to support staff parking and provide designated outdoor space for client use.

CCC has been operating similar programs for decades, including the Hooper Detoxification Stabilization Center (Hooper) since 1982, Oregon's largest withdrawal management facility (serving ~ 3,000 people annually); and the Letty Owings Center since 1997 (serving a combined 200 moms and children annually), located close-in eastside.
