About Us

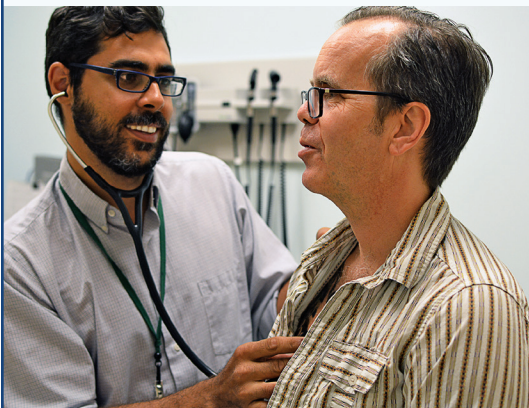
Located in Portland, Oregon, Central City Concern (CCC) provides a comprehensive continuum of affordable housing options integrated with direct social services including health care, recovery and employment. Founded in 1979, CCC serves more than 13,000 people annually, with an annual operating budget of \$100 million and a staff of 1,000. Up to 12,000 people across the tri-county region are affected by homelessness.

What We Do

In 2021, CCC helped 13,434 people experiencing or at risk for homelessness with affordable and supportive housing, integrated health services, addiction recovery and employment assistance.

Who We Serve

CCC serves single adults and families in the Portland metro area who are impacted by homelessness, poverty and substance use disorder.

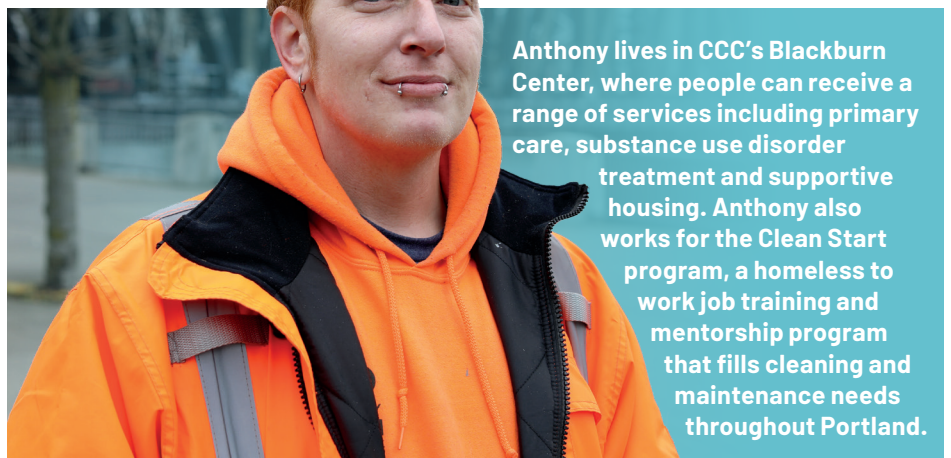
